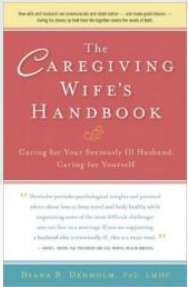


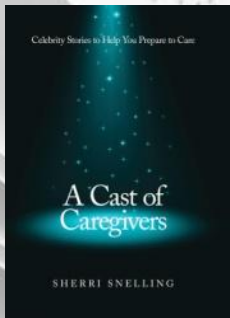

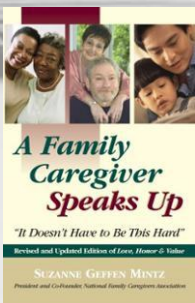


Family Meals – Coming Together to Care for an Aging Parent

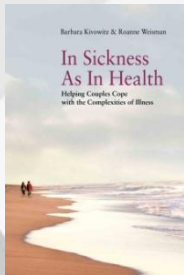
A Family Caregiver Speaks Up: It Doesn't Have to Be This Hard

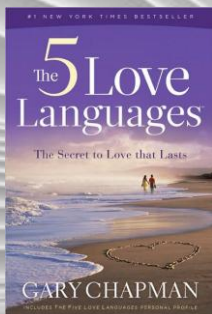

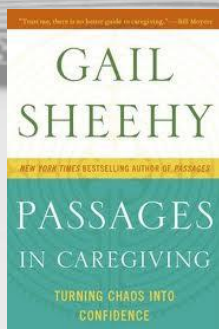
A beautiful photo book which also captures the emotional spectrum in images and words about spousal caregiving for those with dementia.

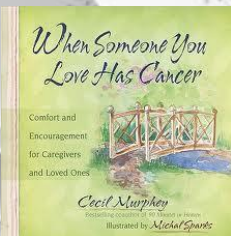


The Tough and Tender Caregiver – A Handbook for the Well Spouse

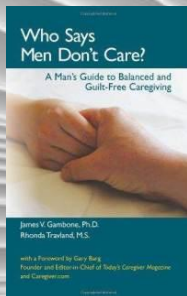


When Someone You Love Has Cancer: Comfort and Encouragement for Caregivers and Loved Ones

A comforting, encouraging book for caregivers of those with cancer.

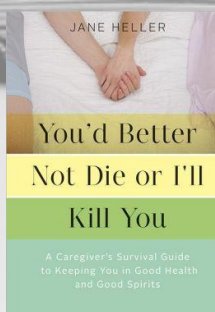


Who Says Men Don't Care? A Man's Guide to Balances and Guilt-Free Caregiving
